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Kenya yalenga fursa zaidi Rais akivutia wawekezaji

Rais William Ruto ameeleza nafasi ya kimkakati ya Kenya katika mfumo mpya wa dunia unaoendelea kubadilika, akibainisha fursa za uwekezaji nchini pamoja na nafasi inayokua ya Afrika katika jukwaa la kimataifa wakati wa mhadhara wa umma mjini Rome, Italia. Akizungumza katika Luiss School of Government siku ya Jumanne chini ya mada "Kenya: Nchi Inayoelekea Mustakabali," Kiongozi wa Taifa alisema Kenya inabuni upya mifumo yake ya serikali kupitia uwekaji kidijitali ili kuboresha upatikanaji wa huduma, uwazi na uwajibikaji katika utoaji wa huduma. "Kwa muda mrefu sana, hasa katika uongozi, tumekuwa tukikubali hali ya kawaida na kuzuia matarajio yetu. Kipindi hicho kimefikia mwisho," alisema Rais Ruto, akibainisha kuwa utawala wake unatekeleza mageuzi makubwa yenye lengo la kuibadilisha Kenya kuwa uchumi wa daraja la kwanza ndani ya kizazi kimoja. Rais alisema serikali inatoa kipaumbele kwa maendeleo



makubwa ya miundombinu, ikiwa ni pamoja na barabara, reli, viwanja vya ndege na bandari, kama sehemu ya juhudi za kuimarisha muunganiko na kukuza ukuaji wa uchumi. Aliongeza kuwa Kenya pia inatekeleza mageuzi ya kilimo yanayongozwa na mauzo ya nje, yakijikita katika usalama wa chakula na

umwagiliaji wa kiwango kikubwa. Alifafanua kuwa hatua hii itahusisha ujenzi wa angalau mabwawa makubwa 50 ili kuwezesha zaidi ya ekari milioni 2.5 za ardhi kutumika kwa uzalishaji, huku angalau miradi mitatu ikitarajiwa kuendelea baada ya ziara yake nchini Italia. Kuhusu nishati, Rais Ruto alisema

Hazina ya Kitaifa ya Miundombinu na Hazina ya Utajiri Mkuu ni vyombo muhimu vya kukusanya mtaji wa ndani na kimataifa kwa ajili ya miradi inayokadiriwa kuwa Euro bilioni 33 (Sh5 trilionl).

Kenya inapanga kuongeza zaidi ya mara tatu uwezo wake wa uzalishaji wa umeme uliopo katika kipindi cha miaka saba ijayo ili kusaidia maendeleo ya viwanda na teknolojia. "Uendelezaji wa viwanda unahitaji nishati inayotegemewa, nafuu na ya kutosha kuendana na kasi ya biashara," alisema. Ili kufadhili malengo haya, serikali inatumia mifumo bunifu ya ufadhili kupitia ushirikiano na sekta binafsi. Alitaja Mfuko wa Kitaifa wa Miundombinu na Mfuko wa Utajiri wa Taifa kama nyenzo muhimu za kuvutia mtaji wa ndani na wa kimataifa kwa miradi inayokadiriwa kugharimu euro bilioni 33 (Shilingi trilionl 5).

Akizungumzia masuala ya bara, Rais alisisitiza umuhimu unaokua wa Afrika katika biashara ya kimataifa, akitaja African Continental Free Trade Area kama jukwaa linalobadilisha hali kwa kufungua soko la watu bilioni 1.4 lenye pato la pamoja la dola trilionl 3.7. Alisema AfCFTA ina uwezo wa kuongeza mauzo ya nje ya Afrika kwa zaidi ya dola bilioni 560 kufikia mwaka 2035, hasa katika sekta ya viwanda na bidhaa za viwandani. "Afrika si tu mpaka mpya wa biashara na uwekezaji wa kimataifa; ni moja ya fursa muhimu zaidi za wakati wetu," alisema. Hata hivyo, Rais Ruto alibainisha kuwa biashara ya Afrika na washirika kama European Union bado inaegemea zaidi kwenye malighafi, huku bidhaa za viwandani zikichangia chini ya asilimia 20 ya mauzo ya nje ikilinganishwa na zaidi ya asilimia 70 katika maeneo yaliyoendelea kiviwanda. Alisema Kenya na nchi nyingine za Afrika zinaweza katika bustani

Serikali yazindua mpango mkuu wa kurejesha ardhi iliyoharibiwa

Serikali imeandaa mkakati wa kurejesha hekta 62,038 za maeneo ya miteremko mikali na kingo za mito yaliyoharibika vibaya, kulinda chemchemi 20 na kuhifadhi maeneo tengefu ya maji, huku ikilenga kuunda ajira za kijani 500,000 kwa vijana kupitia ufugaji nyuki, kilimo mseto cha miti na mazao, pamoja na utalii wa ikolojia. Waziri wa Usalama wa Ndani na Utawala wa Kitaifa, Kipchumba Murkomen, alisema mfumo wa ikolojia wa Milima ya Cherangany ni mojawapo ya minara mitano muhimu ya maji nchini Kenya. Mfumo huo wa ikolojia unachukua eneo la hekta 414,928 katika kaunti nne za Elgeyo-Marakwet County, West Pokot County, Trans-Nzoia County na Uasin Gishu County. Murkomen alisema kwa muda, mfumo huo umeharibiwa na shughuli za binadamu zisizo-dhibitiwa, hali iliyosababisha upotevu wa maisha na riziki, kupungua kwa bioanuwai, pamoja na maporomoko ya ardhi yanayojirudia.



Waziri wa Mambo ya Ndani na Utawala wa Kitaifa (CS), Kipchumba Murkomen, akizungumza, Ijumaa, wakati wa mkutano wa washirika ili kupata uungaji mkono wao wa ajenda ya uhifadhi na urejeshaji.

“Kwa sasa, asilimia 15 ya mfumo huo imeharibiwa vibaya, huku asilimia 67 ikiwa imeharibiwa kwa kiwango cha wastani. Katika mchakato huo, hekta 41,547 za misitu na hekta 76,757 za nyasi zimepotea,” alisema Murkomen. Alieleza kuwa ili kuokoa maisha, kurejesha riziki na kulinda rasilimali hii muhimu lakini iliyo hatarini, serikali imeanzisha

mpango wa Cherangany Hills Ecosystem Restoration for Livelihood Improvement, Sustainability and Harmony (CHERISH); mpango wa kimkakati wa miaka kumi unaongozwa na ajenda ya Rais ya kupanda miti bilioni 15. Akizungumza wakati wa mkutano na washirika ili kupata uungwaji mkono wao katika ajenda ya uhifadhi na

urejeshaji, Murkomen alisema serikali itazindua rasmi mpango wa CHERISH tarehe 22 Mei 2026 katika Kaunti ya Elgeyo-Marakwet, siku inayosadifu na International Day of Biodiversity. Uzinduzi huo utatanguliwa na mbio za kwanza za uhifadhi za Cherangany tarehe 21 Mei 2026 katika kaunti hiyo hiyo. “Tunajivunia kuwa na mwenzangu Dkt. - Interventions to reduce the cost of living, enhance food security, and expand opportunities for youth, women, and vulnerable groups in entrepreneurship, sustainable employment and leadership;
- Proposals to scale up human capital, advance a net-export economy, ensure reliable and affordable energy, and strengthen transport and logistics;
- Measures to strengthen macroeconomic stability and resilience, including responses to climate-related shocks and global geopolitical developments;
- Proposals to enhance domestic revenue mobilization, broaden the tax base, and improve compliance, while minimizing the burden on households and businesses;
- Strategies to promote fiscal discipline and prudent management of public resources; and
- Any other proposals to support inclusive, sustainable growth and economic transformation.

Bandari ya Kisumu kugonga tani 700,000 mnamo 2026

Bandari ya Kisumu iko mbioni kushughulikia zaidi ya tani za metriki 700,000 za mizigo mwaka 2026, ikichochewa na ongezeko la biashara ya kikanda na mtiririko unaongezeka wa bidhaa ambao unaendelea kubadili taswira ya usafirishaji katika Ziwa Victoria. Meneja wa Huduma za Mizigo bandarini humo, Patrick Makau, alisema bandari hiyo ilisajili tani 459,601 mwaka 2025, huku takwimu za mapema za 2026 zikionyesha kasi ya ukuaji unaochochewa na usafirishaji wa bidhaa za mafuta nje ya nchi na kuongezeka kwa biashara ya ndani ya ukanda. Katika mahojiano na KNA ofisini kwake, Makau alisema mwelkeo huo wa kupanda unaakisi ongezeko la mahitaji ya usafiri wa majini katika Afrika Mashariki. “Bandari imekuwa ya kuvutia sana katika kushughulikia mizigo. Ukuaji umekuwa thabiti

sana. Makadirio yetu kwa mwaka huu, 2026, ni kufikia zaidi ya tani 700,000 kwa sababu dalili zote zinaonyesha kuna biashara nyingi ndani ya ukanda wa Afrika Mashariki,” alisema. Alisema usafirishaji wa mafuta nje ya nchi bado ndio nguzo kuu ya shughuli za bandari, ukiungwa mkono na safari za meli za mafuta mara mbili kwa wiki kwenda Uganda kwa kutumia vyombo kama MV Uhuru II, vinavyohudumia maeneo muhimu kama Jinja na Port Bell. Uwezo wa ziada umeongezwa kupitia meli kubwa kama MV Mpungu, inayoweza kubeba hadi tani 1,000 kwa safari, pamoja na vyombo vidogo vinavyosafirisha aina mbalimbali za bidhaa. Makau alisema bandari hiyo pia inashuhudia mseto wa mizigo, ikiwemo kauri, bidhaa za chuma na vifaa vya uchimbaji vinavyopelekwa katika masoko ya kikanda. “Pia tuna baadhi ya vifaa vizito ambavyo tumekuwa tukivisafirisha nje, hasa vifaa vya

uchimbaji na ekskaveta vinavyoelekezwa Tanzania,” alisema, akiongeza kuwa mchanganyiko mpana wa mizigo unaimarisha nafasi ya bandari kama kitovu cha kikanda cha usafirishaji. Alisema ongezeko hilo la shughuli linaonekana pia katika idadi

ya meli zinazolingia bandarini.

Kutoka meli 10 tu zilizorekodiwa mwaka 2017, alisema Kisumu ilihudumia meli 124 mwaka 2025, huku wastani wa sasa wa kila mwezi ukiwa kati ya meli 25 hadi 30. “Mwaka 2017, kwa mwaka mzima tulipokea meli 10 tu. Mwaka jana jumla ilikuwa 124 na kwa wastani sasa tunapokea kati ya 25 hadi 30,” alisema Makau. Kiasi cha mizigo kilichoshughulikiwa katika robo ya kwanza ya mwaka 2026 kilifikia tani 145,753, kikionyesha ongezeko la asilimia 46 ikilinganishwa na kipindi kama hicho mwaka uliopita. Alisema mwezi Machi mwaka

huu pekee, bandari ilipokea meli 26, ikiongezeka kutoka 23 mwezi Februari na 18 mwezi Machi 2025. Kulingana na Makau, kufufuka kwa bandari kumechangiwa na uwekezaji endelevu wa Mamlaka ya Bandari Kenya (KPA), ikiwemo upanuzi wa gati kutoka mita 262 hadi mita 392, kazi za kuchimba kina (dredging) kuboresha kina cha maji kwa meli, pamoja na uboreshaji wa miundombinu ya kushughulikia mizigo. Makau alisema kazi zinazoendelea za kuongeza kina katika sehemu za kuesha meli na kuondoa matope, hasa karibu na gati la Kenya Pipeline, zitawezesha bandari kushughulikia meli zaidi kwa ufanisi.

ENLISTING OF LOCAL AND FOREIGN PROFESSIONAL IRRIGATION SERVICE PROVIDERS

The Irrigation Act No. 14 of 2019 became operational in August 2019. The Act provides for, among other things, the regulation of irrigation development and management throughout Kenya by the Cabinet Secretary responsible for irrigation. In accordance with the Irrigation (General) Regulations, 2021, the Cabinet Secretary is mandated to enlist qualified professionals and service providers involved in irrigation services.

Notice is hereby issued to all qualified professionals and service providers engaged in the following irrigation-related services to apply for enlisting with the State Department for Irrigation in accordance with Regulations 16, 98 and 99 of the Irrigation (General) Regulations, 2021:

- Pre-feasibility studies;
- Feasibility studies and detailed design;
- Installation or construction of irrigation systems;
- Construction supervision; and
- Scheme administration and management;

A person or entity may apply for enlisting as a Professional Irrigation Service Provider upon meeting the following requirements:

- Possession of a degree or diploma from a recognized institution in a discipline relevant to irrigation services (THIRD SCHEDULE, PART A);
- A minimum of five (5) years' practical experience in a profession or discipline relevant to irrigation services;
- Registration with the relevant professional body, where the profession is governed by a professional regulatory body; and
- For foreign professionals, be in possession of a permit from the National Construction Authority.

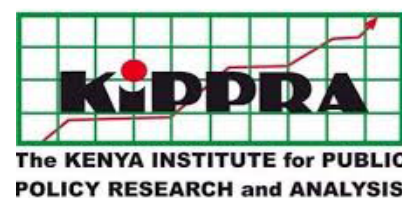
All qualified professionals, firms or contractors seeking to provide irrigation services or undertake irrigation works must be enlisted by the Cabinet Secretary. This requirement will come into force with effect from 1st July, 2026.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applications for enlisting as Local and Foreign Professional Irrigation Service Providers shall be submitted through the eCitizen portal via the State Department for Irrigation online services platform at: <https://irrigationkenya.ecitizen.go.ke/>

Applicants are required to scan and upload all supporting documents in PDF format at the time of application on the platform.

In line with The Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research and Analysis (KIPPRA)'s mandate of developing human and institutional capacities to formulate medium and long-term strategic perspectives for national development, KIPPRA runs a Young Professionals programme as a means of ensuring sustainable development through supply of adequate human capital for effecting public policy processes. The Institute is therefore inviting applications to fill **ten (10) self/institution-sponsored vacant positions**.

The programme is physical and full-time. It is an annual programme, and it includes both coursework and publication of various research outputs. Areas of coursework include the public policy-making process, Introduction to the legislative process, applied research methods, Tools for policy analysis, Governance structures in a Devolved system of Government, Monitoring and Evaluation, Macroeconomic Modeling and Forecasting, Systems of National Accounts and Introduction to Social Accounting Matrix (SAM). By the end of the programme the participants are expected to publish various research outputs.

Sasa anapanga kutumia pikipiki yake ya petroli kwa shughuli nyepesi tu shambani kwake.

The Communications Authority of Kenya (CA) is the regulatory agency for the ICT sector in Kenya with responsibilities in telecommunications, e-commerce, cyber security, broadcasting and postal/courier services. The CA is also responsible for managing numbering and frequency spectrum resources, administering the Universal Service Fund (USF) as well as safeguarding the interests of consumers of ICT services.

As part of this, the Authority manages the aviation radiofrequency spectrum by planning, allocating/assigning and issuing Aircraft Radio Licenses.

In our continued effort to enhance safety compliance in the aviation sector, the Authority, in collaboration with the Kenya Civil Aviation Authority (KCAA), wishes to notify all aircraft operators of a change in the licensing cycle. Effective July 1st, 2026, the Communications Authority of Kenya will be transitioning from the fixed **June 30th** annual expiry of the Aircraft Radio Licenses to a system where the Aircraft Radio License duration will be synchronized with the validity period of the Certificate of Airworthiness (COA) issued by the Kenya Civil Aviation Authority.

To ensure a seamless transition without a lapse in regulatory compliance, the following methodology shall apply:

Transitional Licensing (Post-June 30th, 2026) - Upon the expiry of current licenses on June 30th, 2026 and the settlement of the requisite annual fees, the Authority will issue an initial license. This license will be valid until 30 days after the expiry date of the current COA. This one-time 30-day grace period is intended to allow operators sufficient time to renew their COA with KCAA before applying for the aligned aircraft radio license.

Alignment and Issuance of 12-Month License - Once the renewed COA is submitted to the Authority, a new Aircraft Radio License will be issued for 12 months and will be aligned to the COA's validity period. As this alignment occurs within the same financial year, no additional frequency fees will be levied for this second issuance.

Future Renewal Cycles - Following this one time alignment, all Aircraft Radio Licenses will thereafter operate on a standard 12 month renewal cycle, aligned to the validity of the respective COA, with a built in 30 day buffer to accommodate timely and orderly renewal. This additional month will provide sufficient time for the aircraft operators to renew their COA without creating compliance gaps.

Requirements for Renewal - Operators are reminded that applications for renewal must be accompanied by:

- A valid Certificate of Airworthiness (COA) issued by KCAA.
- A valid Radio Survey Report, issued by KCAA.
- Proof of payment of the prescribed annual license fees.

This initiative is aimed at ensuring that aircraft operators maintain valid documentation across both regulatory bodies simultaneously.

Mswada huo pia utazipa jamii haki za pamoja za mali miliki kwa bidhaa zao, na hivyo kuwawezesha kudhibiti matumizi yake, kuzuia matumizi mabaya na kuimarisha nguvu zao za majadiliano katika soko. Kulingana na Onyango, kaunti zinatarajiwa kuwa na jukumu muhimu katika kutambua, kusajili na kusimamia bidhaa zenye alama za kijiografia, pamoja na kuhakikisha uzingatiaji wa viwango vya mazingira na uzalishaji.

Integration of the Export Process in iCMS with the VAT Return in iTax

Kenya Revenue Authority notifies taxpayers and the public that, effective **May 2026**, the VAT return export data in iCMS will be integrated with the declaration of zero-rated supplies in the VAT return in iTax.

This means that validated export values will be automatically prefilled in the VAT return upon issuance of the relevant export documents by Customs. The change applies to exports to the Single Customs Territory, other foreign countries, Export Processing Zones (EPZs) and Special Economic Zones (SEZs).

To support accurate prefiling, exporters and their clearing and forwarding agents must capture the exporter's PIN and valid TIMS/eTIMS zero-rated invoice number when lodging export documents in iCMS. Only export values validated in iCMS and linked to the exporter's PIN and invoice will be allowed in the VAT return.

Exports of taxable services will also be prefilled in iTax based on generated and transmitted TIMS/eTIMS invoices for the relevant tax period.

The manual is therefore designed to strengthen regulatory implementation, operational practice, institutional capacity and sectoral sustainability in a manner that is practical, measurable and context-appropriate.

The manual will be useful to policy makers, standard developers, fish inspectors, extension officers, researchers, Producers, transporters, processors, consumers, input suppliers, insurance providers, financial institutions and development partners in the aquaculture value chain.

The development of the manual is spearheaded by the State Department for the Blue Economy and Fisheries (SDBEF) in collaboration with the Kenya Fisheries Service (KFS), Kenya Marine Fisheries Research Institute (KMFRI) with technical and financial support from One Health and Development Initiative (OHDI) through the Africa Fish and Aquaculture Welfare (AFIWE) Program supported by Coefficient Giving.

WRUAs zilizonufaika na fedha hizo ni Mwachiga, Mazola Mienzeni, Upper Mwache, Mwang'ombe Ngoni, Marenje Mulunguni, Mulunguni, Chigulu Ngeyeni, Nyongoni, Gude Dambale na Mwadudua Vigurungani. “Bwawa la Mwache, lililopo Kaunti ya Kwale, linatarajiwa kusambaza mita za ujazo milioni 186 za maji kila siku kwa Mombasa, Kilifi na Kwale. “Limekusudiwa kuwa tegemeo muhimu kwa ukanda wa Pwani, likitoa maji kwa matumizi ya nyumbani, umwagiliaji na maendeleo ya kiu-chumi. Hata hivyo, uendelevu wake umetishiwa na uharibifu wa vyanzo

vya maji, mmomonyoko wa udongo na mchanga mwingi (sedimentation), hali inayoweza kufupisha maisha ya bwawa na kuhatarisha usalama wa chakula kwa jamii za eneo hilo,” alisema Shurie. Ili kukabiliana na changamoto hizo, alieleza kuwa Mamlaka imeelekeza juhudi kwa WRUAs, ambazo ni taasisi za kijamii zinazosimamia rasilimali za maji katika ngazi ya jamii. Pia, ekari sita za maeneo ya kuzalisha nyasi aina ya vetiver zimeanzishwa na miti 27,000 ya asili na matunda imepandwa. Aidha, miradi ya kujipatia kipato imeendelea kustawi, ikiwemo ufugaji wa kuku, mbuzi, nyuki pamoja

Safari ya Kasera kutoka darasani hadi karakana yazalisha jiko za kuokoa nishati kwa wenyeji

Wakati Grace Kasera aliacha kazi yake katika sekta ya mashirika yasiyo ya kiseri-kali (NGO), wengi waliiona kama hatua ya hatari. Kuacha ajira thabiti baada ya miaka ya kazi ya kitaaluma kwa baadhi ya watu kulionekana kama kurudi nyuma. Hata hivyo, kwa Kasera, uamuzi huo uliendeshwa na wito wa ndani zaidi—familia, kusudi, na maono ya kubadilisha namna kaya za kawaida zinavyopika. Mhitimu wa Shahada ya Elimu Sayansi kutoka Chuo Kikuu cha Kenyatta, Kasera alianza kazi yake kama mwalimu katika Chuo cha Kisumu Polytechnic. Hata hivyo, baadaye safari yake ilibadilika, ikichanganywa elimu, uhandisi na ujasiriamali katika safari isiyo ya kawaida lakini yenye athari kubwa. Baada ya kipindi chake cha ualimu, Kasera alijiunga na shirika lisilo la kiserikali, akifanya kazi katika kambi za wakimbizi kama msi-mamizi wa elimu. Baadaye alirejea Kisumu na kujihusisha na biashara ya umeme ya familia yao—Nyangweso Electric Coils—uzoefu uliomchochea kupenda ubunifu wa umeme. Ili kuongeza ujuzi wake wa kiufundi, alijiunga

na Mamlaka ya Mafunzo ya Viwanda (NITA), ambako alisoma uhandisi wa umeme. Hapo ndipo safari yake ya utengenezaji ilipoanza. “Nilikuwa na hamu ya daima ya kutengeneza kitu changu mwenyewe,” alisema. Udadisi wake ulianza kuzaa matunda. Kasera aligundua namna ya kuboresha koili ya kawaida ya watt 1,800 ili itumie umeme kidogo zaidi bila kupunguza ufanisi—uvumbuzi ambao sasa unafafanua bidhaa zake. Akifanya kazi kutoka katika karakana yake, hutengeneza aina nne za majiko ya umeme yanayookoa nishati, yaliyoundwa kwa kuzingatia uwezo wa kumudu, usalama na ufanisi. Licha ya tofauti za muundo, majiko yake yote yameundwa kufanya kazi kwa usalama kwenye soketi za kawaida za majumbani. “Tunatumia ukubwa uleule wa waya, plagi ileile na fomula maalum ya kiufundi ili majiko yasichome soketi,” alieleza. Mfano wake wa bei nafuu zaidi, jiko la aina ya kiti, huuzwa kwa Sh2,800, wakati jiko la boksi la otomatiki huuzwa kwa Sh3,800. Jiko la boksi lenye swichi huuzwa kati ya Sh4,500 na Sh5,000, huku modeli kubwa zaidi ya boksi mbili ikiuzwa kwa Sh7,800. Kasera huchagua kwa uangalifu vifaa kwa ajili ya uimara na ufanisi, akitumia mabamba ya chuma ya vipimo tofauti, juu ya alumini na nyaya zinazostahimili joto.

Baadhi ya modeli pia zina swichi, kutegemea mahitaji ya wateja. Kwa miaka 18, amejenga wateja waaminifu kutoka kada mbalimbali, wakiwemo walimu, madaktari, maafisa wa polisi, wanafunzi na wauguzi. “Mwanzoni, wateja wangu wengi walikuwa watu wa familia, hasa wanaume. Lakini baadaye niligundua pia nina wateja wengi katika sekta ya usalama,” alisema. Kwa mujibu wa Kasera, mvuto wa bidhaa zake unatokana na ufanisi wa matumizi ya nishati na urahisi wa matengenezo. “Kile kinachowafurahisha wateja wangu ni kwamba majiko yetu hayapotezi nishati. Tuligundua namna ya kutengeneza koili zenye ufanisi na rahisi kutumia,” alisema. Alibainisha kuwa majiko mengi ya kuagiza kutoka nje ni ghali sana au magumu kuyatunza, wakati mbadala wake wa ndani hutumia vifaa vinavyopatikana

kwa urahisi. “Baadhi ya koili za nje zina-weza kugharimu hadi dola za Marekani 3,500, lakini zetu zinapatikana katika maduka ya vifaa vya umeme kwa gharama ndogo sana,” alisema. Kasera anasema elimu yake ya sayansi ilimsaidia kujenga msingi wa kiufundi na sasa ni mtetezi wa mafunzo ya ufundi kama suluhisho la ukosefu wa ajira kwa vijana. “Mafunzo ya kitaaluma ni muhimu, lakini mara nyingi yanakupeleka kutafuta ajira. Ujuzi wa kiufundi unakuwezesha kuunda fursa zako mwenyewe,” alisema. Ameajiri vijana kadhaa katika karakana yake, akiwashirikisha katika ufundi wa chuma, uhomeleaji na uunganishaji wa vifaa. Anawahimiza vijana na wale wanaobadilisha taaluma wasikate tamaa. “Nilianza ufundi wa chuma nikiwa na miaka 48. Vijana wengi hukata tamaa mapema sana. Wanapaswa kupata taarifa wanazohitaji na kuanza,” alisema. Kasera alisema safari yake haikuzuliwa na jinsia au umri. “Kwenye kazi za kiufundi,

kinachojalisha ni matokeo. Haijalishi kama wewe ni mwanamke au mwana-mume,” alisema. Alikiri kuwa kujulikana kumesaidia sana kupanua biashara yake, akitaja habari katika gazeti la eneo kama iliyoongeza uelewa wa umma kuhusu kazi yake. Sasa akiwa na miaka 66, Kasera anatarajia kuongeza uzalishaji na kuwafikia kaya zaidi. “Hii ni bidhaa yenye sifa za kuokoa nishati na urahisi wa matumizi. Natumai kupanua na kuwahudumia watu wengi zaidi,” alisema. Alianza na majiko mawili tu kutokana na mtaji mdogo lakini ameendelea kukuza biashara yake kwa miaka mingi. Wateja wake, alisema, wameripoti kuokoa gharama kubwa za umeme. “Baadhi ya kaya hutumia tokeni za Sh50 kupikia vyakula vigumu, wakati nyingine zimepunguza gharama ya kupika kwa mwezi kutoka takribani Sh3,000 za mkaa hadi karibu

Sekta ya kahawa nchini yaandikisha mapato mazuri ya Sh24.7 bilioni

Sekta ya kahawa nchini Kenya Simeonyesha ufanisi mkubwa, ikipata mapato ya Sh24.7 bilioni katika miezi sita ya kwanza ya mwaka wa kahawa 2025/2026, kutokana na mauzo mazuri katika Soko la Kahawa Nairobi (NCE). Kwa mujibu wa taarifa za NCE, jumla ya magunia 540,843 ya kahawa yenye uzito wa kilogramu 33,240,042 yaliuzwa kati ya Oktoba mwaka jana na Machi mwaka huu, jambo linaloonyesha kuimarika upya kwa sekta hiyo.

Katika kipindi hicho kilichopitiwa, takriban asilimia 75 ya kahawa iliyowasilishwa kwa mauzo ilihusisha madaraja ya juu ya AA, AB na C. Madaraja haya yalivutia mahitaji makubwa kutoka kwa wanunuzi wa ndani na wa kimataifa, na hivyo kuchangia kwa kiasi kikubwa mapato hayo makubwa. Katika robo ya kwanza ya mwaka wa kahawa, kuanzia Oktoba hadi Desemba, soko hilo lilikusanya Sh9.5 bilioni kutokana na mauzo ya magunia 152,785 ya kahawa. Takwimu za soko pia zilionyesha kuwa Alliance Berries

Limited, Kirinyaga Slopes na New KPCU ndizo zilishughulikia kiasi kikubwa zaidi cha kahawa iliyowasilishwa kwenye mnada na wakulima na mashamba makubwa. Alliance Berries Limited ilion-

goza kwa kuwasilisha magunia 178,910, sawa na asilimia 33.08 ya kahawa yote iliyouzwa. Kirinyaga Slopes ilifuata kwa magunia 83,506 au asilimia 15.44, huku New KPCU ikitoa magunia 75,393, sawa na asilimia 13.94.

Kwa upande wa wanunuzi wa kahawa, Ibero iliibuka mnunuzi mkuu baada ya kununua magunia 172,566, ikiwa ni asilimia 31 ya kiasi chote kilichouzwa. Wanunuzi wengine wakuu walikuwa C. Dormans yenye magunia 89,809, Kenyacof yenye magunia 69,223 na Taylor Winch yenye magunia 62,856. Katika mahojiano na KNA, mtaalamu wa kilimo anayefanya kazi na mnunuzi katika Ushirika wa Kahuhia wa Murang'a, John Chege, alisema ufanisi huo umechangiwa na mafunzo endelevu kwa wakulima kuhusu usimamizi bora wa zao. Alibainisha kuwa wakulima wa kahawa wamekuwa wakipata maelekezo kuhusu kupogoa mimea, kudhibiti wadudu na magonjwa ili kuongeza uzalishaji na kuboresha ubora.

Serikali, washirika wahimiza uwekezaji zaidi katika sekta ya ufugaji nyuki nchini

Ufugaji nyuki unaibuka kama nguzo muhimu katika mageuzi ya kilimo nchini Kenya, huku wadau wakitoa wito wa kuongezwa kwa uwekezaji na kuimarishwa kwa sera ili kufungua kikamilifu uwezo wake. Hii inafuatia mkutano wa wadau wa ufugaji nyuki ulioratibiwa na Idara ya Serikali ya Maendeleo ya Mifugo kupitia Kurugenzi ya Uzalishaji wa Mifugo, kabla ya Maadhimisho ya Siku ya Nyuki Duniani ya mwaka huu. Jukwaa hilo liliweka nyuki katikati ya ajenda ya mageuzi ya kilimo

na ustahimilivu wa mabadiliko ya tabianchi nchini Kenya. Mkutano huo uliowaleta pamoja watunga sera, watafiti, sekta binafsi na washirika wa maeendeleo, ulisisitiza mabadiliko muhimu ya mtazamo, ukibainisha kuwa ufugaji nyuki si tena shughuli ya pembezoni bali ni mnyororo wa thamani wa kimkakati wenye uwezo wa kuendeleza usalama wa chakula, uhifadhi wa bayoanuwai na maisha endelevu kwa kiwango kikubwa. “Nyuki, ambao mara nyingi hufanuliwa kama ‘mifugo midogo zaidi’, wana mchango mkubwa katika kusaidia uzalishaji wa kilimo. Hii inaonesha fursa wazi na ya haraka ya upanuzi wa uzalishaji, kuongeza thamani na kubadilisha uagizaji kutoka nje. Akizungumza katika mkutano huo, PSMueke alisisitiza umuhimu wa kuimarisha mwelekeo wa kibiashara wa sekta ndogo hiyo.

Aliwahimiza pia wadau wa sekta kuongoza katika kukuza ukuaji wa sekta, akibainisha kuwa sekta binafsi inapaswa kuchukua nafasi ya uongozi katika kuendeleza ubunifu, kuongeza thamani na kukuza masoko katika mnyororo wa thamani wa ufugaji nyuki.

Wataalamu wa kiufundi katika mkutano huo walisisitiza umuhimu usiopingika wa nyuki katika mifumo ya kilimo na ikolojia. Mkuu wa Ufugaji Nyuki Regina Ciira alieleza kuwa zaidi ya uzalishaji wa asali, nyuki ni muhimu katika ukuzaji wa mbegu za malisho, urejeshaji wa ardhi ya malisho na uzalishaji wa bidhaa zenye thamani kubwa kama nta ya nyuki, propolis, jeli ya kifalme na chavua. Akizungumza wakati wa siku ya shamba kwa wakulima katika eneo la Amagoro, Teso Kaskazini, Mratibu wa Kilimo Biashara wa CGA Kaunti ya Busia Eliya Barasa alisema kuwa aina mbili bora za karanga, Ndovu na Mwangaza, ziko katika hatua ya kuzidishwa mbegu. Aidha, aina hizo mbili pamoja na Kanga na Dove, sambamba na aina za asili, zimewekwa katika majaribio ya mashamba katika maeneo ya Teso Kaskazini, Teso Kusini na Nambale, alieleza. "Hizi ni aina bora, maana yake zinatoa mavuno ya juu zaidi. Kwa sasa tuna ekari 25 zinazozidishwa mbegu katika maeneo hayo matatu," alisema. ya Elgeyo Marakwet ambapo baadhi ya wakulima walivuna magunia kati ya 60 na 80 ya karanga aina ya Ndovu ambazo hazijachunwa ganda kwa ekari moja. Kwa mujibu wa Barasa, kilimo cha karanga kimekuwa rahisi zaidi kutokana na msaada wa Mpango wa Chakula Duniani (WFP), ambao umetoa mashine za kumenya karanga kupitia vituo vyake vya ubunifu. "Iwapo una kiasi kikubwa cha karanga, kuna mashine ya kumenya inayopatikana Jairos, Teso Kaskazini. Wakulima hawahitaji tena kutegemea kazi za mikono," alisema. Aliwahimiza wakulima kutumia Aflasafe, bidhaa ya kibaiolojia inayosaidia kupunguza sumu ya aflatoxin na kuboresha usalama

na ubora wa karanga. Barasa pia aliwahimiza wakulima wa Teso Kaskazini kuanzisha kilimo cha mazao mengine yanayostahimili ukame kama mtama, ulezi na muhogo kwa ajili ya biashara. Alisema CGA kupitia mpango wa Farm to Market Alliance (FMA) inaunganisha wakulima na masoko ya uhakika kwa mazao yao, ikiwemo mtama na karanga. "Tunashirikiana na Greenwells, Thrive Agric na East African Breweries Limited (EABL), ambao wanatoa soko la uhakika la mtama kwa wingi," alisema. Kwa upande wa karanga, Barasa alisema CGA imeingia ubia na Mamlo Foods, kiwanda kidogo cha usindikaji kilichoko Amagoro, kununua karanga kwa wingi kwa ajili ya uzal-

ishaji wa siagi ya karanga. Aliongeza kuwa mpango wa FMA unatumia mfumo wa Vituo vya Huduma kwa Wakulima (Farmers Service Centres - FSC), ambapo wakulima wali-ofunzwa huwasaidia wengine kukusanya mazao ili kukidhi mahitaji ya soko. Wanafunzi watano kutoka kaunti zilizo katika mpaka wa mfumo ikolojia wa Tsavo wamepatiwa ufadhili wa masomo ya uhifadhi unaolenga kuimarisha juhudi za ulinzi wa wanyamapori na kukuza kizazi kipya cha watunzaji wa mazingira. Walioteuliwa walitangazwa wakati wa uzinduzi wa kundi la pili la Mpango wa Ufadhili wa Mashujaa Vijana wa Uhifadhi (Young Conservation Heroes Scholarship) mjini Voi, mpango unaotekelezwa na African Wildlife Foundation kwa ushirikiano na Wildlife Clubs of Kenya. Mpango huo unawalenga wanafunzi wanaoishi karibu na makazi ya wanyamapori, ukitoa elimu ya

sekondari inayofadhiliwa kikamilifu, ushauri nasaha (mentorship) na mtaji wa kuanzisha miradi ya uhifadhi inayotegemea jamii. Akizungumza wakati wa uzinduzi huo, Mkurugenzi wa Nancy Githaiga nchini Kenya alisema mpango huo unalenga kuwawezesha vijana kushiriki na kuathiri moja kwa moja juhudi za uhifadhi katika jamii zao. Alibainisha kuwa jamii zinazoishi karibu na hifadhi za wanyamapori mara nyingi hubeba mzigo wa migogoro kati ya binadamu na wanyamapori, hivyo kuna umuhimu wa kuhusisha jamii hizo katika kutafuta suluhisho za uhifadhi.
